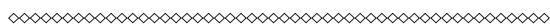

BINT EL FUNK

Ashkenaz teams up with Small World Music to co-present the Canadian premiere of Israel's next breakout world music sensation, Bint El Funk (Daughter of Funk). The group combines American-style funk with traditional Jewish Yemenite music, influenced by Afro beat, jazz, Mediterranean music, psychedelic-Turkish music and more. Alongside Yemenite texts are love songs, social protest songs, Bedouin nonsense, and poetry. The group's performances evoke a tribal party, with sounds, rhythms, colors, and scents uniting in a feast for the senses that connects Sana'a in Yemen, Harlem in the US, and the Shaariya neighborhood in Petach Tikva, Israel. Over the last few years Bint El Funk has built a loyal following at clubs and music festivals all over Israel and is now poised for breakout success on the world stage. This event is presented as part of the monthly concert series by Polyphonic Ground, a collective initiative of 11 Toronto-area presenters of culturally-diverse music.

CELEBRATION OF FREEDOM

A triple bill of contemporary dance choreographed by Avinoam Silverman

Canada-Israel Cultural Foundation is very proud to present this wonderful evening of contemporary dance featuring three works by Israeli dancer/choreographer Avinoam Silverman.

Shedding Eve is a solo work loosely based on the biblical character Eve. This work examines our relationship to traditions and the tension inherent in the choices we make as we forge our own paths out of our histories. Just as a snake sheds its skin, we shed different aspects of ourselves as we continuously ask questions, learn and grow.

Anvil 18 presents a respectful critique of the ballet world. The title refers to the idea that ballet dancers are hammered, shaped and moulded both physically and psychologically by their experiences. It also looks at and gives expression to the range of feelings dancers experience such as frustration, joy, anger, sadness, helplessness, despair and excitement.

In Between is a new work commissioned for *Spotlight* 2018. Avinoam left his home in Israel at a fairly young age to come to the National Ballet of Canada and pursue his career. This work explores what happens to us when we leave our roots behind -- what do we sacrifice, what do we gain? How does it shape our identity and who we become? How does living 'in between' two worlds affect us psychologically and emotionally?

EXCHANGING NOTES:

An Interview with **AYELET TSABARI**,
Writer in Residence

Toronto Public Library Writer in Residence Ayelet Tsabari discusses the writer's life and craft. Ayelet's debut story collection *The Best Place on Earth*, won the Sami Rohr Prize for Jewish Literature and the Edward Lewis Wallant Award, was long listed for the Frank O'Connor International Short Story Award, and was a NY Times Book Review Editors' Choice. Excerpts from her memoir in essays, *The Art of Leaving*, (to be published in 2019 by HarperCollins Canada) have won a National Magazine Award, a Western Magazine Award, and an Edna Staebler Award. She has also won a Chalmers Arts Fellowship, and is currently working on a novel, under contract with HarperCollins Canada.

Born in Israel to a large family of Yemeni descent, Ms. Tsabari grew up in Tel Aviv, and travelled extensively throughout South East Asia, Europe and North America. She studied film and photography in Capilano University's Media Program. She directed 2 documentary films, one of which won an award at the Palm Spring International Short Film Festival.
